## Embed Widgets on Microsoft Teams



This user guide explains how to embed a Dashboard Widget on Microsoft Teams.  
Guide for Portal Admins and Dashboard Owners.

### Introduction

Is your organization using Microsoft Teams? Integrating your InfoDesk Dashboard or selected Dashboard widgets on Teams is a smart way to ensure that your stakeholders don't miss any news from your portal. You can integrate the full Dashboard or select specific Dashboard widgets to share on Teams. This article and the attached User Guide explain how to embed a Dashboard Widget on Microsoft Teams.

You can also integrate InfoDesk Dashboards and Dashboard Widgets on other platforms. Reach out to your InfoDesk Account Manager or Customer Success to discuss your needs and explore all possibilities.



## Integration Prerequisites


When embedding Dashboard widgets on other websites, you need an authentication mechanism. The recommended authentication mechanism is single sign-on, SSO. An alternative authentication mechanism is Key Authentication.

### SSO

The easiest way to integrate is to use single sign-on (SSO). SSO allows viewers to seamlessly access the Dashboard Widgets from your intranet without the need for a username and password. The viewer is not required to have an account in Wide Narrow, and it can be created automatically.

Note that if you don't have SSO in place, you will get a message that "SSO is not configured for this portal" when embedding the widget.

### Machine Users/Key Authentication

If you don't have SSO implemented, you can use Key Authentication to give your stakeholders access to the Dashboard Widgets on Teams. A prerequisite is that a dedicated Dashboard user with a generated authentication key, a so-called Machine user, is created on the User page in Admin.

To create the machine user, you need help from InfoDesk Support.

When the Machine user is created, Portal Admins can prepare the embedding by copying the Machine User Authentication Key on the User page in Admin.

If you don't have SSO access to Wide Narrow, you can use Machine Users/Key Authentication to give your stakeholders access to content from Wide Narrow on other platforms.

## How to Embed a Dashboard Widget on Teams

### In your Wide Narrow Portal:


#### STEP 1

##### Option 1. Select widgets from the Shared widget page:

Navigate to Dashboards and click on the **Go to Widgets** tab at the top of the page.

Click the **Embed widget** button on the widget you want to embed.

Please note that only widgets with a visible embed button can be embedded.





## Option 2. Select widgets from a specific Dashboard:

Navigate to the Dashboard overview page.

On the Dashboard card, click the More button (three dots) and select **Manage Widgets**.

Mouse over the widget you want to embed. Click the More button and select **Embed Widget**.



## STEP 2

Choose the **Single Sign on (SSO)** or **Key Authentication** tab to copy the embed widget URL to use on Teams. Contact [InfoDesk Support](#) if you need assistance.

### With SSO implemented

1. Select the **Single Sign on (SSO)** tab on the Embed widget pop-up.
2. Copy the embed widget URL starting with 'https://api.ciportal' on the upper text bar and save it to paste on Teams.
3. Proceed with the instructions under the "**In Microsoft Teams**" section below.

Single sign on (SSO)

Key authentication

What is SSO?

A widget can be integrated on an external website, e.g. your intranet. The recommended authentication mechanism is SSO. A prerequisite is that single sign-on (SSO) is set up between the external website and Wide Narrow. The user will be logged on with a personal account and see content corresponding to what would be seen in Wide Narrow. Different users can therefore possibly see different content in the same widget.

To embed the widget on the website

1. Add an html `<iframe />`
2. Set the source (src) to the Embedding URL with SSO

### Machine User/Key Authentication

You can use Machine Users/Key Authentication to give your stakeholders access to the Dashboard Widgets on Teams. To create the machine user, you need help from [InfoDesk Support](#).

When the Machine user is created by InfoDesk Support:

1. Go to the **User** page in **Admin** and select **Machine Users**.
2. Open the Machine User account and click the **Display Key** button.
3. Copy the Machine User **Key**.

Follow the instructions in STEP 1 above to open the Embed widget pop-up and continue with the following:

1. Select the **Key Authentication** tab on the **Embed Widget** pop-up.
2. Replace "**REPLACE\_WITH\_KEY**" in the URL displayed in the upper text bar with the generated Machine User Key.
3. Copy the entire URL from the upper text bar in order to use it on Teams and follow the instructions under the "**In Microsoft Teams**" section below.

What is key authentication?

A widget can be integrated on an external website, e.g. your intranet. The recommended authentication mechanism is SSO. An alternative authentication mechanism is Key authentication. A prerequisite is that a dedicated widget user is set up with a generated key.

[Generate a key](#)

The person viewing the widget will be authenticated to the widget as the shared widget User and will have less possibilities to interact. All persons viewing a Key authenticated widget will see the same content.

To embed the widget on the website

1. Add an html `<iframe />`
2. Set the source (src) to below and make sure to replace REPLACE\_WITH\_KEY with your key



## In Microsoft Teams:

1. Open the Teams channel where you want to embed the dashboard widget.
2. Click the **Add a tab** button (+ icon) and select the **Website** app.
3. Under **Tab name**: Enter the name of the widget you want to integrate.
4. Paste the copied widget URL from the embed widget pop-up in Wide Narrow.
5. Click **Save**.

The widget is now displayed as a new clickable tab on top of your Teams channel, ready to be shared with the Team members on Microsoft Teams.
